### Rector's Letter ....

Dear Friends,

During our Wednesday night services (and consequently on Friday nights online) we are currently considering what we can learn from the Book of Jonah.



I wonder when it was that we might have last looked at this short story? It is a story about a running from the will of God and his immense mercy, not only to Jonah who should have known better, but also to the Ninevites whose wickedness had really caught the attention of the holy God. There are many avenues of thought that arise from the book of Jonah. If you'd like to know more, have a look at our YouTube channel and catch up with the sermons on Friday nights, or I can personally recommend 'The Prodigal Prophet' written by Timothy Keller.

What God would have for us to do at times can cause us to want to run! Sometimes we can feel completely ill equipped and under qualified for the role. Other times we wish he would choose someone else due to the sacrifices that will have to be made. Whether we believe that God is calling us into a new form of service, a refined lifestyle, a deeper devotion to him and people in our lives, or in other ways, it can seem that a lot is asked of us, even more than we can manage.

If what we sense that God is asking of us is great, we can be deeply encouraged by the message of Pentecost. His Spirit has come upon the Church. To his followers Jesus promised in John 14  $^{16}$  And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—  $^{17}$  the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you."

Being a disciple of Jesus Christ is far from easy. It can feel overwhelming. But we are not alone. We serve in honour of the King of Kings and we do so enabled by his Spirit. Let us be open to what the Lord would have for us to do. Let us discuss how we might serve him more with a faithful Christian friend. Let us regularly ask the Lord in prayer, how it might be that he would desire for us to glorify him.

### **BOOK CLUB**




### **CONGRATULATIONS!**
